Dissertation work: Comparative study of men and women police officers across Canada. In-depth interviews with 80 women and 20 men from 25 different police services to ascertain their experiences of police culture, including what barriers remain, possible solutions, and policy creation.

Completion of 1 year Masters program with honors, offered direct entry into the PhD program. Courses included: policing, life course theory, statistics, contemporary theory. Original qualitative research conducted titled: "I Took the Blue Pill: The Effect of Hegemonic Masculine Police Culture on Canadian Policewomen's Identities." Study included in-depth interviews with 15 policewomen from 5 Southwestern Ontario police forces.
